Introduction

"Twi-what?" may be just the question you keep asking yourself these days. In short, people are referring to the 'Twilight' phenomenon that is spreading the globe with vampire speed. In an age where cell phones, text messages and social networking are the norm one woman's dream is breaking records and creating ripples of change worldwide that shows no sign of losing speed anytime soon.

Whether or not you have been bitten personally by the 'Twilight' phenomenon yet, the odds are that with the record selling books, box-office record breaking movies, hit soundtracks, television talk show appearances and celebrity affiliations, you have at least felt a nibble. Your odds are increased greatly if you are associated in any form with teenage girls and well, women in general! The far reaching range of this growing phenomenon is apparently boundless as it has grown from the dream of a mother of three (3) in Arizona to a worldwide multi-billion dollar industry in a human heartbeat.

In a world of instant access and constant changing information via the World Wide Web, this publication is to stand as a piece of history for later generations who will no doubt find the 'Twilight' series and become engrossed in it. As prior generations had The Beatles, Elvis, Star Trek, Star Wars, Harry Potter and the lists go on, now is the time of 'Twilight'. In the American culture, you can normally tell when something is reaching a phenomenon status when references start creeping into popular culture in magazine covers, movies, commercials and late night programming. The "Twilight" phenomenon has spawned a movie parody called Vampires Suck, television show references, innumerable fan websites and fan fiction. Select members of the cast appeared on Oprah in May 2010 to promote the release of The Twilight Saga: Eclipse (Pattinson, Stewart, Lautner, & Fanning, 2010). Jimmy Kimmel Live also did a

prime time segment airing Wednesday, June 23, 2010, promoting the June 30, 2010, release of *The Twilight Saga: Eclipse* (Jimmy Kimmel Live, 2010). It only takes one search of any search engine for *Twilight*, Stephenie Meyer or Robert Pattinson to yield literally millions of hits.

This book will serve as your road map to the 'Twilight' phenomenon. All roads have a beginning, so I will begin this journey by defining the two major classifications within the 'Twilight' phenomenon realm. This will assist you with classifying the 'Twilight' person in your life. A Twilighter can be defined as someone who has read the 'Twilight' series and is familiar with the 'Twilight' world. They know things about the book series, movies, Stephenie Meyer, the actors that portray the characters and other things like that to some varying degree. They enjoy it for what it is . . . a fictional world based on mythical creatures for entertainment purposes. A Twihard (combination of 'Twilight' and Die-Hard fan) is all of the above plus typically a combination of the following:

- ➤ They live and breathe everything 'Twilight'.
- > They have declared a "team" affiliation and wear 'Twilight' merchandise showing their allegiance.
- > Often times, they have their room (usually teenagers) or a section of their house (some 'TwiMoms') that is decorated 'Twilight'. This can range from movie posters, blankets, full-size cutouts of Edward and/or Jacob, dolls and a daily growing list of items.
- ➤ They often quote in everyday conversations from the books and/or movies.
- ➤ They want to visit Forks, Washington.
- > They have been to or want to attend a 'Twilight' convention.
- ➤ They visit 'Twilight' related websites daily often multiple times per day.
- > They are members of more than one 'Twilight' site and frequently post their opinions or declare their team allegiance there.
- > They can tell you everything about their characters movie incarnate. *Examples:* They can tell you what film Kristen Stewart has coming out next, what Taylor Lautner is working on now and where in the world is Robert Pattinson.

Basically 'Twilight' has become part of their daily life existence; 'literary crack' for them that they must consume daily and share with everyone that will listen. They can probably tell you how many times they have read each book and have seen each movie <u>OR</u> they may even be to the point that they don't even count anymore.

Stephenie Meyer

Across this world, humans have long debated the origin of our existence. Theories range from a single deity to random chance and everything in between. Although this question will no doubt be debated for the remainder of our existence, the creator of the 'Twilight' world is the direct result of one woman and a dream. The 'mother' of the 'Twilight' world is Stephenie Meyer.

An English graduate from Brigham Young University who lives with her husband and three (3) children in Arizona had a dream on June 2, 2003, that would end up changing the world's vocabulary to include new meanings to the words like sparkle, vampire and hitch and the creation of new terms, such as 'Team Edward', 'Team Jacob' and 'Twihards'. Stephenie Meyer's dream contained characters that seemed 'real' to her. Upon awakening that morning, she began to write what would approximately three (3) months later become the young-adult novel, *Twilight*. *Twilight* is the unlikely love story of a teenage human girl, Bella Swan, and a vampire boy, Edward Cullen. The original dream became much of what can be read in *Twilight*, Chapter 13, "Confessions", where Bella and Edward retreat to 'their meadow' and pivotal choices are made that grow to effect their futures and the futures of those around them. Twilight debuted at No. 5 on The New York Times' Best Seller List in 2005. Since then, it has spawned a saga that includes four (4) total published books, three (3) movies released to date, conventions, merchandise, and the final book scheduled to be released in two (2) movie installments . . . thereby reaching phenomenon status. It is pretty incredible! Phenomenon status was reached from a stay-at-home mother's dream, where she hoped she might make enough money to pay off her families' mini-van, once she mustered up enough courage to
